Fr Anthony Percy

Fr Anthony Percy has a Doctorate (STD) from the John Paul II Institute
in Washington DC. Up until August 2008 he was the parish priest of
Goulburn in NSW. He is currently the Rector of the Seminary of the
Good Shepherd in Homebush. Fr Anthony is the author of *‘Theology of*
the Body Made Simple.’ Written with the lay person in mind, Fr Anthony
writes in an easy to read manner about the topics of sexuality, the human
body and relationships and how the teachings by JPII have meaning and
purpose in our lives.

Fr John Flader

Fr John Flader was born in Wisconsin, U.S.A. Besides degrees in chem-
istry and theology, Fr John has a Doctorate in Canon Law from the Uni-
versity of Navarre. His doctoral dissertation, which was published by the
University of Navarre Press, was on mixed marriages. He was ordained a
priest of Opus Dei in Segovia, Spain, in August 1967, and came to Aus-
tralia in March 1968 to be the first chaplain of Warrane College, a posi-
tion he held until 1991. From 1992 to 1997 he was chaplain of the Uni-
versity of Tasmania in Hobart. In 1998 he moved to Melbourne where he
was chaplain of RMIT University from 1998 to 2001. In 2002 he was
appointed Director of the Catholic Adult Education Centre for the Arch-
diocese of Sydney, a position which he currently holds. During his years
in Australia he has preached numerous retreats to priests in many dio-
ceses of Australia, as well as to lay people in many cities. He has pub-
lished numerous articles on issues of canon law, the spiritual life and the
Church. Since January 2005 he has written the “Question Time” column
in “The Catholic Weekly” and since July 2007 the column has appeared
also in the Perth Catholic newspaper “The Record”. His book *Question*
Time – 150 Questions and Answers on the Catholic Faith, was published
by Connor Court in 2008.

Sister Mary Madeleine OP

Sister Mary Madeleine is a member of the Dominican Sisters of St
Cecilia Congregation in Nashville, Tennessee. She currently holds a
Masters in Theology degree from the University of Steubenville, Ohio.
Normally Sisters of this community would be at home teaching, but
their motherhouse in Nashville has sent delegations to assist with prepa-
rations for each World Youth Day since Denver 1993. Sister Mary first
came to Australia at the request of Bishop Anthony Fisher O.P. to assist
in the planning and coordination of the World Youth Day. Currently,
Sister Mary is a part of the Sydney community, the first permanent
mission of the Sisters of St Cecilia to be established outside the USA.
As of February 2009, Sister Mary will be a permanent member of the
University of Sydney Catholic Chaplaincy team.
